MEMO: Monthly Activity – June, 2021

DATE: Friday, July 2, 2021

The following is a summary of activity for the month of June, 2021:

1st, 9:00 PM: Lt. Bethia investigated a drug-related death on N. Lannon Rd. WSD Detectives assisted in the investigation.

3rd, 3:35 PM: Officer Wearing mediated a family trouble in Whispering Ridge.

4th, 3:00 PM: Officer Polka resolved an ongoing family dispute in Whispering Ridge by phone. Both parties were advised that their concerns were a civil matter and were given suggestions on how to proceed.

4th, 8:55 PM: Officer Polka conducted a prisoner search for WSD in Sussex.

5th, 6:03 PM: Officer LaGosh stopped a subject in Lannon Quarry after business hours, who claimed to be making a TikTok video. A trespassing citation was issued.

5th, 10:57 PM: Officer LaGosh attempted to stop a suspicious vehicle in the construction area in OverStone. The vehicle, which had no plates, fled east on Main St. into Menomonee Falls. The officer did not engage in a vehicle pursuit. No property was reported damaged or missing in the construction area. Extra patrols have since been conducted.

7th, 9:30 AM: An anonymous citizen reported that a homeowner in Whispering Ridge North was constructing an unauthorized access to the Bugline Trail. The complaint was referred to Waukesha County Parks.

8th, 1:35 PM: Chief Bell received a complaint from a business on F&W Court that trucks delivering to ChemRite were driving on private property and causing traffic concerns. ChemRite will work with other businesses to mark the traffic pattern more clearly.

8th, 7:42 PM: Lt. Bethia warned a business on N. Townline Rd. for excessive noise during hours outside those specified in their business plan.

8th, 8:00 PM: Chief Bell and Lt. Bethia responded to a report of a child laying in the road in the 20500 block of W. Good Hope Rd. He was uninjured and advised to play elsewhere.

9th, 12:45 PM: Chief Bell answered questions from both parties by phone regarding the above-referenced ongoing family trouble in Whispering Ridge.

9th, 8:00 PM: A resident complained of two youths on a scooter shouting and gesturing profanities at pedestrians near Good Hope and Lannon Rds. The citizen was unable to identify the actors or the scooter. Officer Polka later located the scooter in Joecks Park and referred the matter to parents of the juveniles.

11th, 2:30 PM: Chief Bell received a complaint regarding noise from a business on Townline Rd. The complainant will attend the next board meeting to voice his concerns. The business was issued a final warning.

14th, 12:10 PM: Chief Bell responded to a residence in Lannon Estates for a strange subject in their house. The subject was given permission by a different family member to be there. All parties were advised.

14th, 6:14 PM: Chief Bell cited a resident for operating heavy trucks on Forest View Drive in violation of signs.

16th, 7:00 AM: Chief Bell investigated a natural death in Lannon Estates.

16th, 10:20 AM: Chief Bell mediated a dispute at ChemRite in which a delivery driver refused to leave after being unable to unload his product.

17th, 10:42 AM: Chief Bell returned a stray dog to its owner in the 20500 block of W. Good Hope Rd.

17th, 11:00 AM: Officer Lang, our newest officer, was sworn in.

17th, 12:51 PM: Chief Bell received a call about concerning statements made to a healthcare worker by a resident of a rooming house on N. Lannon Rd. The resident was determined not to be suicidal as presumed.

19th, 5:43 PM: Officer LaGosh investigated a call of a suspicious-looking person on the Bugline Trail. He was not found.

21st, 9:50 PM: WSD responded to a call of persons climbing on a car in the village hall parking lot. The persons in question were the vehicle owners who reside next door, attempting to make car repairs.

22nd, 7:40 AM: Chief Bell responded to St. John's Church for a fire alarm which was determined to be malfunctioning.

25th, 1:15 PM: Chief Bell investigated a noise complaint from the same business on Townline Rd. The offender in this case was determined to be a customer and the business was closed at the time. The business is cooperating and will warn customers to minimize their vehicle noise.

28th, 10:45 AM; Chief Bell took delivery of a medication disposal box which is now located in the Village Hall lobby. The box was provided by a grant from CVS which was arranged by Officer Polka.

29th, 7:23 PM: Lt. Bethia responded to a child reporting child abuse in Lannon Estates. The complaint was baseless.

29th, 7:30 AM: A known local citizen pumped gas at Lannon BP and promised to return later to pay. He failed to return and was cited for defrauding the gas station.

30th, 10:30 AM: Chief Bell took a complaint of a construction worker who was observed urinating outdoors at the Rock Pointe development site. The developer was instructed to caution workers against such behavior.

30th, 1:00 PM: Chief Bell took a complaint of a truck speeding on Lannon Rd. every morning at 5:30 AM. The driver was eventually cited on July 2nd for speeding.
