MEMO: Monthly Activity – April, 2022

Date: May 2, 2022

April 1st, 1:30 PM: Chief Bell met with the owner of CS Motorsports on Townline Rd. to advise them a noise complaint had been received this past weekend. Video showed the business was closed and nobody was there at the time alleged by the complainant.

1st, 1:45 PM: A theft by contractor complaint was received at the department. It was ultimately referred to Hartford PD.

2nd, 5:33 AM: Ambulance call, N. Weather Edge Circle.

3rd, 1:03 PM: Officer Baisley investigated an accident on private property in the 7200 block of N. Lannon Rd.

3rd, 4:30 PM: Officer Baisley responded to a report of a reckless auto in the 19500 block of W. Main St. He was unable to locate it.

3rd, 9:06 PM: WSD took a resident of N. Vine St. into custody on a warrant.

4th, 5:36 PM: Lt. Bethia responded to the Bugline Trail for an injured bicyclist.

6th, 12:30 PM: Chief Bell conducted a well-being check on a resident of Lannon Estates who was reportedly unable to care for themselves. The resident was found to be self-sufficient and has a support network.

7th, 4:32 PM: Officer Chin handled a threat complaint in Lannon Estates.

7th, 7:09 PM: Officer Chin responded to an alarm at Luxury Auto, which was a false alarm.

8th, 8:45 AM: Chief Bell warned a resident on Main St. regarding loose garbage stacked along the curb that was blowing into the road.

8th, 2:15 PM: Chief Bell was made aware of a Facebook Messenger scam in which the scammer demands money in exchange for not reporting the victim to the police for having allegedly committed a crime. In this case the victim was advised to adjust his privacy settings and report the account to Facebook.

8th, 7:38 PM: Officer Lang directed traffic around a moving van stuck in the ditch at W. Main St. and W. Edgewood Dr.

9th, 10:00 AM: Officer Polka and Officer Lang staffed the Easter Bunny event at Village Hall.

9th, 11:22 PM: Ambulance call, Lannon Estates.

11th, 12:30 PM: Chief Bell mediated a dispute regarding renewing a lease at Lannon Estates.

11th, 1:30 PM: Chief Bell took a report of harassment via text messages in Lannon Estates.

12th, 9:45 AM: Chief Bell filed a car vs. deer accident on W. Main St.

12th, 3:35 PM: Lt. Bethia conducted a welfare check of a resident on N. Lannon Rd. who made suicidal statements to a social worker. He was determined not to be a threat to himself.

12th, 8:33 PM: Alarm, ChemRite. False alarm.

13th, 12:17 AM: Washington County Sheriff initiated a pursuit in their jurisdiction that went south on N. Lannon Rd. from W. Menomonee Av. The pursuit was terminated, however the suspect continued to flee and drove through Lannon. South of our village, south of W. Fairview Av., the fleeing driver lost control and struck a tree, killing the passenger. The driver sustained non-life threatening injuries and was taken into custody. Menomonee Falls PD investigated the crash.

13th: Department members participated in firearms training at the Oconomowoc Lake PD Firearms Range.

14th, 1:40 AM: WSD discovered the rear gate open at Luxury Auto which is unusual. The area was checked and nothing was amiss.

14th, 12:34 PM: Officer Lang responded to an anonymous report of a possible drink driver near Good Hope and Townline Rds. She located the auto, but the driver was not impaired.

14th, 12:45: Officer Lang assisted WSD in corralling a loose dog near Townline Rd. and Bonnie Ln.

15th, 1:30 PM: Chief Bell assisted Berg employees in attempting to catch a loose husky "Athena" in the Overstone development. It eluded capture.

15th, 5:35 PM: Officer Wearing checked village parks and quarries for a missing person reported by WSD who may be in our area. Not located.

15th, 6:30 PM: Officer Wearing directed traffic around a disabled vehicle at Main St. and Lannon Rd.

15th, 9:30 PM: Officer Wearing responded to a report of a family trouble in Lannon Estates. Citations were issued.

18th: Security camera installation at the Village Hall was completed.

20th: Menomonee Falls PD advised that the occupants of the vehicle that Washington County pursued on 4/13 probably discarded a firearm somewhere on Lannon Rd. between County Line Rd. and Fairview Dr. Police K-9s have checked likely areas. No firearms have been found yet.

21st, 5:45 PM: Officer Wearing responded to a complaint of mini bikes on the Bugline Trail near Main Street. They were not located on this occasion, however Officer Polka later located them on 4/24. The operators were cited by WSD.

23rd, 5:02 AM: 911 no cause, Lannon & Main.

25th, 12:15 PM: Chief Bell responded to the Bugline Trail near the Halquist Quarry for a suspicious package, which turned out to be a box of abandoned toys.

27th, 5:50 PM: Officer Baisley received a call of a possible drunk driver near Lannon Rd. and Main St., which he was unable to locate.

29th, 10:18 AM: Chief Bell investigated a hit and run accident at Good Hope Rd. and Main St. The driver was later identified and cited.

29th, 11:30 AM: Chief Bell took a report of a forgery from a resident.

29th, 3:45 PM: The manager of Circle S Storage reported that one of his renters had a catalytic converter stolen from a vehicle stored there in the past week or so. The investigation is ongoing.

29th, 4:33 PM: Officer Chin investigated an accident on Bonnie and Townline involving a school bus. There were no injuries. The bus driver was cited.

30th: Lannon PD hosted a drug take-back event which netted 8 lbs. of unwanted prescription medications that will now be safely disposed of.
