MEMO: Monthly Activity – June, 2022

Date: July 1, 2022

June 1st, 12:00 PM: A citizen found a dog in the area of Lake and State Sts. and turned him in to the PD. His owner was located a short time later.

1st, 5:49 PM: Alarm, 20079 W. Main St. Unknown cause.

3rd, 8:02 AM: Road rage complaint, Lannon Rd. & Good Hope Rd. Unable to locate vehicle in question.

29th: A burglary and criminal damage to a warehouse near the Narrow Lane border with Menomonee Falls was determined to have occurred around June 7th. Four juvenile suspects have been identified. The investigation is ongoing.
