November 1<sup>st</sup>, 1:30 PM: Suspicious, Schneider Field. A passerby claimed there were ten bodies lying on the baseball field. Investigation revealed it was part of the activity of a group that rented the Lions Club building.

2<sup>nd</sup>, 11:44 PM: Drug complaint, Rock Pointe Apartments. Caller can smell marijuana emanating from a nearby apartment. Unable to locate same.

4<sup>th</sup>, 12:20 PM: Traffic stop, Good Hope & Willow Ln. A small amount of marijuana was recovered.

4<sup>th</sup>, 3:58 PM: Reckless auto, Lannon & Good Hope. Gone on arrival.

12<sup>th</sup>, 4:45 PM: Attempt arrest, 117<sup>th</sup> & Silver Spring, Milwaukee. Two Lannon officers attempted to arrest a suspect at the above location who is wanted for a Lannon fraud. The suspect, who also has numerous warrants, resisted arrest and was tased but ultimately escaped in a vehicle. Numerous criminal charges were filed.

13<sup>th</sup>, 1:42 AM: Drug complaint, Rock Pointe Apartments. The caller stated occupants of a car were smoking drugs, then went into an apartment. A knock and talk was conducted and no drugs were detected.

13<sup>th</sup>, 8:46 AM: Assist other department (WSD), Lannon Estates. Eviction.

14<sup>th</sup>, 2:44 AM: Alarm, Rock Pointe Apartments. False alarm.

14<sup>th</sup>, 5:51 PM: Suspicious, Sunnyside Cemetery. A caller reported seeing a group of people with flashlights in the cemetery after closing. Subjects were Boy Scouts removing flags.

Determined to be from a nearby business burning cardboard, and residual smell from the house fire on the 14<sup>th</sup>. A strong odor of smoke was present throughout the village.

16<sup>th</sup>, 12:02 AM; Suicide threat, Rock Pointe Apartments. A high school teacher received an email from a teenage female student suggesting the student was suicidal. Crisis was notified, emergency detention criteria was not met. The student's parents were given resources.

16<sup>th</sup>, 9:08 AM: Injured person, Bugline Trail & Custer Av. Bicyclist fell off bicycle and lost consciousness, treated by MFFD.

16<sup>th</sup>, 10:31 PM: Suicide threat, Lannon Estates. Female student sent texts implying she was contemplating suicide. Crisis implemented a safety plan. This individual and the suicidal student from the 16<sup>th</sup> were in the friend group of an individual who completed suicide earlier this month.

19<sup>th</sup>, 4:41 AM: Injured animal, Lannon Estates, possibly a coyote. Unable to locate.

19<sup>th</sup>, 12:20 PM: Ambulance call, 21500 block W. Good Hope Rd. Diabetic issue.

21<sup>st</sup>, 11:50 AM: Assist other agency (Menomonee Falls PD), hit and run crash, Lannon Rd. & County Line Rd. Striking auto was located and held for MFPD.

21<sup>st</sup>, 12:50 PM: Ambulance call, Whispering Ridge.

21<sup>st</sup>, 9:29 PM: Dispute, Twelve29. Wedding party took property belonging to the caterer. Advised parties this is a civil matter.

22<sup>nd</sup>, 2:15 PM: Reckless auto, 7300 block N. Bay St. Citizen reports a reckless auto in the area of Lannon & Hemlock which she followed to an address on Bay St. Vehicle was gone on arrival.

24<sup>th</sup>, 8:28 PM: Dispute, Rock Pointe Apartments. Suicidal girlfriend was arguing with boyfriend. No action taken by crisis.

27<sup>th</sup>, 9:33 AM: Suspicious, Rock Pointe Apartments. Caller reports her sister left Potawatomi with an unknown male last night, she has not been able to reach her and her phone is pinging in this location. Phone contact was eventually made.

27<sup>th</sup>, 4:10 PM: Domestic, 21800 block W. Good Hope Rd. One adult male arrested for disorderly conduct – domestic violence related.

28<sup>th</sup>, 11:15 AM: Traffic hazard, Main & Townline. Debris removed.

28<sup>th</sup>, 12:22 PM: Suspicious, 20200 block W. Good Hope Rd. Caller with psychiatric history called to report suspected human trafficking. Caller had no specific details.
