

## VILLAGE OF LANNON POLICE DEPARTMENT

MEMO: Monthly Activity – December 2024

Date: January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025

December 1<sup>st</sup>, 12:47 PM: Hunting violation, 7700 block N. Becker Dr. Anonymous caller reported seeing several hunters with rifles enter the woods. Unable to locate.

1<sup>st</sup>, 9:33 PM: Well-being check, 21800 block W. Good Hope Rd. Subject made suicidal statements to a friend. No action taken by crisis.

4<sup>th</sup>, 11:00 AM: Assist other agency (WSD), for a missing elderly male from Willow Springs Mobile Home Park. He was eventually located in Butler near 124<sup>th</sup> and Silver Spring on foot.

4<sup>th</sup>, 12:55 PM: Traffic hazard, Custer Lane & Bugline Trail. WE Energies crews tracked a large amount of mud onto the road, which was later swept up.

4<sup>th</sup>, 4:50 PM: Traffic hazard, Good Hope & Main. High winds blew barricades into the intersection, which were removed.

4<sup>th</sup>, 5:52 PM: Well-being check, 21800 block W. Good Hope Road. A psychiatric facility requested a check on a resident who threatened suicide earlier. Did not meet emergency detention criteria, will be handled by the family.

4<sup>th</sup>, 7:11 PM: Assist other agency (WSD), Good Hope & railroad tracks. The above subject left his residence on foot, parents expressed concern that he was still suicidal. Subject was determined not to be a threat to himself and was allowed to continue walking.

5<sup>th</sup>, 9:30 AM: Assist other agency (WSD), 20900 block W. Main St. Hamilton HS school resource officer requested a check on a student who emailed a vague suicidal statement. No action taken by crisis.

5<sup>th</sup>, 1:30 PM: Psychiatric crisis, 21800 block W. Good Hope Rd. Subject was breaking car windows, screaming and threatening suicide. He eventually consented to voluntary treatment and was transported to a facility by officers.

6<sup>th</sup>, 7:20 AM: Assist other agency (Brookfield PD), who advised they received a report from a Lannon resident that she was being followed in their jurisdiction by one of her neighbors who was trying to rob her. The complaint was later determined to be baseless.

6<sup>th</sup>, 5:30 PM: Officers staffed the Christmas Tree Lighting event. No issues were reported.

6<sup>th</sup>, 7:45 PM: Threats, Rock Pointe Apartments. A female called to report she was previously allowed into her mother's apartment. The mother was now threatening to return and inflict physical injury onto the daughter. The daughter was conveyed to an address in Milwaukee.

8<sup>th</sup>, 4:56 AM: Threats, 7300 block N. Lake St. One subject made threats to another during a breakup. Instructions on obtaining a restraining order were provided.

9<sup>th</sup>, 3:49 PM: 911 no cause, Whispering Ridge.

10<sup>th</sup>, 5:19 PM: Domestic, Rock Pointe Apartments. No physical contact occurred, One subject was given a ride to a residence in Milwaukee.

11<sup>th</sup>, 5:50 PM: Alarm, Rock Pointe Apartments. False alarm.

11<sup>th</sup>, 5:51 PM: Alarm, 21500 block W. Good Hope Rd. False alarm.

12<sup>th</sup>, 9:22 AM: Ambulance call, Dairyland Bus.

12<sup>th</sup>, 5:13 PM: Alarm, 21500 block W. Good Hope Rd. Door was found open, building was searched and door was resecured.

13<sup>th</sup>, 5:30 PM: Assist other agency (West Bend PD), Rock Pointe Apartments. Officers checked residence for a witness to a hit and run accident in their jurisdiction.

16<sup>th</sup>, 4:30 PM: Officers distributed \$1250 in gift cards to 5 Lannon families in need. Our department originally received the gift cards from Police Lights of Christmas for our motorcycle unit's participation in their fundraising ride this summer.

17<sup>th</sup>, 11:00 AM: Water main break, 20100 block W. Main St. Construction crews struck a water main in the parking lot while digging. The entire village experienced a temporary loss of water pressure which lasted several hours. Residents were notified of a water boil notice in effect until 12/20.

17<sup>th</sup>, 3:05 PM: Assist other agency (WSD), Good Hope & Town Hall Rd. The Hamilton HS school resource officer advised squads that she had information that there was a student on a school bus with a gun. Officer Schweitzer responded to the bus which had stopped at Good Hope and Town Hall Rds. and determined the student in question was not on it. Officer Schweitzer later responded to the Kwik Mart in Sussex where the student was ultimately located. The student was searched and did not have a gun on his person at that time.

18<sup>th</sup>, 8:23 AM: Officers provided a visible presence at Lannon Elementary School after the Madison school shooting and the student with a gun call on the school bus earlier this week.

18<sup>th</sup>, 11:15 AM: Reckless driver, 19500 block W. Main St. Resident reports that yesterday at 4:00 PM a vehicle passed his house at 90-100 MPH. Officer monitored that area at the same time today, no violations were found.

18<sup>th</sup>, 1:20 PM: Reckless driver, westbound Falls Parkway from Roosevelt in Menomonee Falls. The vehicle did not make it into the village.

18<sup>th</sup>, 9:05 PM: Theft, Rock Pointe Apartments. A package from Amazon left on a doorstep was stolen. Report filed.

19<sup>th</sup>, 9:18 AM: Well-being check, Bugline Train & Lannon Rd. An employee was terminated from a business and appeared to be intoxicated, last seen walking away on the Bugline. The subject was eventually found at his residence.

19<sup>th</sup>, 12:00 PM: Assist other agency (Menomonee Falls PD), Whispering Ridge. A Flock camera in Menomonee Falls observed a vehicle that was reported stolen in Milwaukee which belonged to a Lannon resident . Officers checked the owner's residence and found the vehicle had been recovered earlier but not yet taken out of the system by Milwaukee PD.

19<sup>th</sup>, 5:20 PM: Disabled auto in traffic, Main & Townline.

19<sup>th</sup>, 6:32 PM: Assist other agency (WSD), Townline Rd. Officers checked the area for a hit and run auto, which was not located.

19<sup>th</sup>, 6:55 PM: Assist other agency (WSD), Jeanine Lane in Sussex. Officer assisted a call of a domestic violence in progress with a barricaded subject.

20<sup>th</sup>, 8:17 AM: Burglary, 20700 block W. Main St. Actor(s) broke into the building overnight and took car keys to a vehicle in the lot, which was then stolen (a silver 1978 Olds 98, lic. 818ZKR).

22<sup>nd</sup>, 1:04 PM: Intrusion alarm, Rock Pointe Apartments. False alarm.

23<sup>rd</sup>, 12:24 PM: Ambulance call, 20400 block W. Main St.

23<sup>rd</sup>, 12:38 PM: Maintain Peace, Lannon Estates. A resident and her infant child were evicted by her mother and had no place to go. They were eventually placed in a shelter in Milwaukee.

23<sup>rd</sup>, 11:30 PM: Noise complaint, Lannon Estates. A resident regularly sleeps in his car, idling for hours at a time. The resident was advised to discontinue this practice.

24<sup>th</sup>, 3:23 PM: Psychiatric crisis, Lannon Estates. A juvenile was causing property damage to the interior of the house. She eventually calmed down. No action taken by crisis.

24<sup>th</sup>, 4:36 PM: Ambulance call, Rock Pointe Apartments.

26<sup>th</sup>, 5:44 PM: Possible drunk driver, Custer & Main. WSD broadcast a possible drunk driver eastbound on Main from Townline. Officer located the vehicle and stopped it. The driver was not intoxicated but received a citation.

26<sup>th</sup>, 9:39 PM: Dispute, Whispering Ridge. Officer maintained the peace during an argument between two divorcing parties.

27<sup>th</sup>, 6:46 PM: Traffic stop, Main & Forest View. Officer recovered 11.6 grams of marijuana during a traffic stop for speeding.

28<sup>th</sup>, 10:27 AM: Suspicious auto, Lannon Estates. Caller reported a suspicious car driving around the area. Gone on arrival.

30<sup>th</sup>, 7:42 PM: Traffic stop, Main & Forest View. A traffic stop for speeding resulted in recovery of a small amount of marijuana and a pistol slide with no serial number, which were inventoried.
