Widely recognized as a use-of-force expert, Lt. Kuspa played a key role in developing the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board's Defense and Arrest Tactics Manual. He has served as an expert witness in numerous court cases and was instrumental in shaping this agency's policies and training programs.

Lt. Kuspa's contributions have left a lasting impact, and his absence will be deeply felt. He leaves behind a legacy and shoes that are impossible to fill.
