23<sup>rd</sup>, 1:55 PM: Parking trouble, 7200 block N. Lannon Rd. A complaint was received that vehicles were parked partially in traffic at an event at McDugout. No vehicles were found to be in violation.

23<sup>rd</sup>, 7:54 PM: Dispute, Lannon Estates. One of the parties agreed to leave and was given a ride to a friend's house.
